## **LETTER FROM CAROLYN KHALFANI**

Dear Supporters,

Archer Community Access Center (ACSC) is pleased to submit this request for a contribution on behalf of students living in rural Alachua County.

ACAC provides after-school tutoring, public Internet access, 4-H programs, and youth sports programming as part of its overall crime prevention/youth development program. We partner with other youth service organizations within our service area, including Alachua/Levy 4-H Extension, the City of Archer Recreation Department, Alachua County Youth Build, Job Corps, Corner Drug Store, and local faith-based organizations. These funds will be used to help cover general expenses incurred in the day-to-day operations of providing those services listed, including: Internet service, utilities, rent, study supplies, transportation, and program fees.

## **JOSIAH WALLS, continued**

When Josiah Walls ran for the U.S. Senate, someone fired a bullet which missed him “by inches.” His opponent, Silas Niblack, was a former slave owner. When Walls won the election, Niblack accused him of fraud, saying a black man could not possibly win against a white opponent. When Walls ran for senate for a second term, he beat Niblack again, this time by more than 1,600 votes! Although he was a senator, he could not stay in hotels in Tallahassee or Washington, D.C. because of his race.

Walls graduated from law school, started his own law firm in Gainesville and served as the first black mayor of Gainesville. He set aside land in Florida A. and M., an African American university, and served as the director of this university until his death in May 1905.

**ARCHER HISTORY CORNER:  
JOSIAH WALLS**

Josiah Walls was born a slave in Virginia in 1842. During the Civil War, he was forced to fight for the Confederacy, but when he was captured by Union forces, he changed sides and fought for the Union. He joined the first black infantry regiment and became a sergeant major. At the end of the war, he purchased farm land near Gainesville.

He married Helen Ferguson. He worked for a lumber camp, but he quit the job because women were not allowed at the lumber camp, and he missed his wife. Then he got a job teaching school in Archer.

At the beginning of Reconstruction, former slaves were allowed to vote. In Alachua County at this time, blacks outnumbered whites and could therefore out-vote them.

Our summer program (June through August 2011) will be instrumental in keeping students involved in healthy fun-filled learning activities, serving as a deterrent to crime and other risky behaviors.

## Archer Water Rates to Increase in June

On January 10<sup>th</sup> of this year the City Commission voted to modify the method of billing and rates of the city's Potable Water System. One of the major changes to the billing system was the removal of the 3000 gallons of water allowance built into the base rate. The Base rate is currently \$15.31 and provides for an allowance of 3000 gallons of water. The new residential base rate will be \$11.70 but will have no minimum water allowance included. Commercial Base rates were also reduced from \$18.71 to \$17.50 and the water allowance discontinued. In addition to the change in the base rate the current system of seven tiers of billing rates was reduced to 4 levels. These rate changes were the result of a three month study conducted by the

Florida Rural Water Association. The purpose of the study was part of an effort to reorganize the Water fund into a true enterprise fund and require the fund to stand on its own without support from other city funds (a requirement of Florida Statutes). Using the new billing structure the water fund will be able to fund a depreciation account for the replacement of pumps and water lines. The new billing will also allow the Water fund to operate without having to transfer monies from other Funds. new billing software. **The bill you receive at the end of June will reflect the new rates.** The city in working with Alachua County will be hosting a citizen's workshop on water conservation and what you can do to conserve water in your home or business. This workshop will be held on June 7<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 PM at City Hall. The city also has available at City Hall pamphlets which have suggestions on the conservation of water. Look on the reverse of this letter to see samples of old and new charges along with the old and new water use tiers.
