FLORIDA HISTORY CORNER

Seminole Chief Betty Mae Tiger Jumper

After the third Seminole War, the few remaining Seminoles in Florida fled to the Everglades. Because of the way they had been mistreated, many of them had a strong hatred of white people. As recently as the 1920's, any Seminole woman who was caught having a love affair with a white man was severely beaten, and the white man was killed, along with any children resulting from the relationship.

In 1923, a Seminole member of the Snake Clan, Ada Tiger, fell in love with a white trading post owner, Abe Parton. Seminoles and whites were not allowed to marry, and they had a daughter born out of wedlock. Her name was Betty Mae. A group of angry Seminole men came to Ada's house, intending to beat Ada and kill the baby and her father. Betty's grandfather, Tom Tiger, and her great uncle, Jimmie Gopher, aimed their rifles at the angry crowd and refused to let them near the house. Jimmie Gopher fired a warning shot into the crowd, and one man was hit by the bullet. The police arrested Jimmie, but the marshal waited before taking Jimmie to jail, allowing him time to inform the men in the crowd that if the child was harmed in his absence, he would seek revenge when he got out of jail.

Betty Mae's mother was a midwife, and it worried Betty Mae that so many Seminole babies did not survive. She wanted to learn modern medicine to improve their survival rate, but there were no schools for Seminoles in Florida. Her Uncle Jimmie found a Seminole boarding school in Oklahoma and raised the money to send Betty Mae there. She was the first Seminole to graduate from high school. Later she was the first Seminole to graduate from medical school and the first Seminole woman to become chief of the entire Seminole Nation.

She married Moses Jumper, a World War II hero who made money wrestling alligators for the tourists. When Moses became ill, Betty Mae learned to wrestle alligators and took his place. She was a very attractive young woman, and the tourists were thrilled to see her wrestling alligators!

Betty Mae founded three tribal newspapers and was editor of the Seminole Tribune. She lectured young people about drugs and about school attendance. She was named among the top fifty Indian women in the U.S. in 1971. President Richard Nixon appointed her to the National Indian Opportunity Council. She was named "Woman of the Year" by the Jewish Women's Defense League and "Pioneer Woman" by the city of Dania. She is now a very active 87-year-old. *M. Zander*
