Archer Community Survey

The Alachua County Sheriff's Office Crime Prevention Analyst, Kristen Benedini told the City Commission about a survey of Archer in order to: better understand the Archer community, identify areas for improvement, identify residents who want to be involved in improving their community, and to identify ways to address the concerns of the residents by building on the strengths of the community. The survey was conducted on August 25th, 2012, at the Kangaroo Station from 10 AM to noon by Kristen Benedini and Deputy Leo Lowe. They completed 49 surveys and asked questions such as: How long have you lived in this area? What do you like about Archer? What does it have to offer its residents? What would you like to see added or changed for Archer? Some suggestions made by citizens included: better bus service, more sidewalks, better storm drains, nature trails, more job opportunities, more community activities, clean-up of litter, and a safer park.
